1. Names

- First Middle Last (last name at birth)
- Maiden name for females
- Don't use "Unknown"
 - Leave field blank in formatted forms
 - Use (---?---) in written reports

Recording Conventions



2. Dates

- Day Month Year
- Don't abbreviate months

3. Places

- Smallest jurisdiction to largest (town, township, county, state, country)
- Use jurisdictional names that existed at the time of the event
