## Source Analysis

### 1. Type of source

- a. Original source -the first/unaltered recording of the information
- b. Derivative source - produced by copying an original record or manipulating its content (e.g. transcription, index, database)
- c. Authored source - narrative created by someone who has studied the subject

### 2. Informant - Source of the information

- a. Primary information - firsthand information provided by a participant or eyewitness of the event

- b. Secondary information – secondhand information provided by someone who did not witness the event
  - c. Indeterminant – source of the information is unknown
3. **Evidence** - Relatedness of the information
- a. Direct evidence – explicitly answers the research question
  - b. Indirect evidence – only provides supporting evidence of a fact by inference or through patterns of connections
  - c. Negative evidence – “an inference drawn ... from an absence of information or situation that should exist under given circumstances.” (Elizabeth Shown Mills, *Evidence Explained*, 4<sup>th</sup> ed. (Baltimore: Genealogical Publishing Co., 2024) 703.
